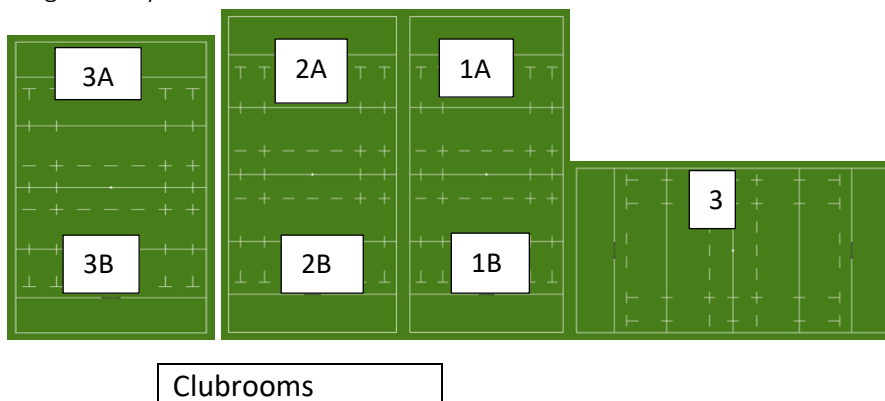

In 2024 changes are being made to Junior Ruby:

- Grade names will align with new grade ages - U6s will be Ferdie 1, U7s Ferdie 2, U8s Ferdie 3 etc.
- Ferdie 1 and Ferdie 2 grades will be rippa for the whole season.
- Tackle clinics will be provided to all teams, players and coaches before they play tackle in Ferdie 3.
- Ferdie 3 will be 7 aside on a quarter field with no scrums or lineouts.
- Girls can continue to play down a year in mixed competition.
- There are no safety weights for 2024.

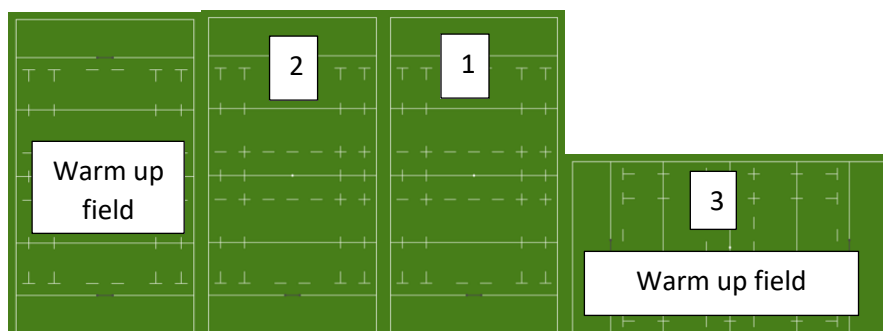

OUR GROUNDS

LOCATION

Our clubhouse and home grounds are located at Vogeltown Park, 199 Carrington Street, New Plymouth.

ACCESS

Vehicle and pedestrian access to the park is from Carrington Street. There is additional pedestrian access from Plympton and Torbay Street and through the Truby King Dell off Brooklands Road which is also known as Struan Walkway.

PARKING

There is limited parking at the grounds and restricted space for turning/maneuvering. For all training and home games, players and their supporters are encouraged to park on Carrington Street to allow club officials, referees, catering and support staff to have easy access to the Whitehouse.

FIELDS

Diagrams of the field layout are outlined in the junior and senior club sections of this handbook.

After periods of heavy or persistent rain, there may be times that trainings or matches are moved to another location to conserve the condition of the turf.

The players are to ensure the fields are kept tidy, with all strapping tape removed at the end of the game. No glass bottles, glasses etc. are to be used or taken outside of the clubroom.

THE WHITEHOUSE

The Whitehouse has been refurbished in the last few years and we ask that users of the venue treat it with respect. Placing rubbish in bins, returning plates, cutlery and glassware to the kitchen or bar would be appreciated.

There are change rooms, showers and toilets provided in the change area for the use of players and referees.

There are guest toilets located in the main part of the clubhouse.

BAR AND KITCHEN

The bar and kitchen are operated by ABC Catering who also hold the liquor licence. All alcohol must be purchased through the bar unless prior arrangements have been agreed to between the board and ABC Catering. ABC Catering is operated by Ant Bates.

During the season the club is open for meals on a Thursday night – players, supporters and families are all more than welcome to come for a meal and a drink. The Club has a coffee cart located adjacent to the fields for all home games. Please support our caterers where you can.

We expect all bar and kitchen staff to be treated with courtesy.

VENUE HIRE

The Whitehouse is available for public hire for a variety of functions other than 21st birthdays.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- The club defibrillator is located on the outside of the clubroom, closest to the entrance driveway
- No glass is to be taken outside of the clubroom
- The bar staff will call a taxi for you at your request
- No pets or animals are permitted inside the clubroom

GAME DAY

Traditionally the junior club plays on a Saturday morning and the senior club in the afternoon. With the recent acquisition of lights this provides opportunities to play in the evening which we will look to implement with the consent of the opposition teams as it fits within the season.

The parents of the junior teams are responsible for cleaning/tidying the Whitehouse after the junior matches. There is a cleaning rota in place for the senior teams. Please ensure if you are on cleaning duty that you give it your best – we know this is not anyone's fun activity, but many hands make light work.

The Club Captain and Junior Convenor are available for all matchday enquiries and assistance.

LIVE STREAMING

If you are unable to come to the grounds to watch a match, all senior games are live streamed on YouTube. Please keep an eye on our facebook page for streaming channels prior to game day.

TECHNICAL ANALYST

A Technical Analyst works with the senior teams and videos and/or drones the senior matches played on our home grounds. For junior matches a TRRA referee, or a person who has completed the Small Blacks Course or Associate Referee Course can be used.

CODES OF CONDUCT

FOR EVERYONE

- Respect the 'Game of Rugby'
- Respect the referee, your team, the opposition and coaches at all times
- Applaud all good play whether it is your team or the opposition
- Abuse, in any form, of players, coaches, referees or other attendees will not be accepted
- There is to be no 'poaching' of officials or players

FOR PLAYERS

- Play for enjoyment and being part of the rugby family. Remember that the goals of the game are to have fun, improve your skills and feel good
- Respect the 'Game of Rugby' and play within the laws of the game
- You are responsible for your opponents' safety. Tackle hard, fairly and legally, do not play to hurt your opponent
- Respect your opponent. Treat all players as you would like to be treated. Do not 'bully', 'trash talk' or take advantage of any player
- Your captain is the only person who should ask the referee any questions during the match
- Accept the referee's decision, always. Do not argue with an official. If you disagree with a decision, inform your captain, coach or manager during a break or after the game
- Play with control. Do not lose your temper.
- Use appropriate language with players, coaches, officials and spectators. Verbal abuse of any kind, deliberately distracting or provoking an opponent, is not acceptable.
- Be a good sport. Applaud all good play whether by your team or the opposition
- At the end of the match, thank your opponents and the referee
- Display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat
- Rugby is a team sport - cooperate with your coach, teammates and opponents.
- Always do your best and be committed to the game and your team.
- As part of the team, it is important you attend training regularly, listen to your coach and help your team
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants, regardless of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- If you receive a card during a match, remember it was your decision that led to that card, and you alone have let your team down

FOR COACHES

- Remember that players participate for enjoyment and winning is only part of the fun
- Lead by example – you are your players' role model
- Your players are a reflection of you, whether they play fairly or behave badly - it is important that you instil the core values of rugby in the players
- Never ridicule or yell at players for make a mistake or not winning
- Be reasonable in demands on players' time, energy and enthusiasm.
- Operate within the rules and spirit of the game, and teach players to do the same
- Teach your players that the laws of the game are mutual agreements which no one should evade or break
- Ensure that the time players spend with the coach is a positive experience. All players deserve equal attention and opportunities
- Ensure that equipment and facilities meet safety standards and are to the age and ability of all players
- Display control and professionalism to all involved including opponents, referees, coaches, administrators, parents and spectators. Encourage players to do the same.
- Always demonstrate respect for the opposition as well as for the judgement of the officials and opposing coaches
- If you require clarification from the referee, save questions for after the match has completed
- Improve players through good coaching - frequent matches and long training sessions do not guarantee success
- Show concern and caution toward sick and injured players and follow medical advice when determining whether an injured player is ready to recommence training or competition.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in the game, irrespective of their gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Remember that as a coach of an 'age-grade team' you are acting 'in loco parentis' and that you have a duty of care to all your players

FOR PARENTS, GUARDIANS OR OTHER FAMILY MEMBERS

- Remember, people play rugby for their enjoyment, not only yours.
- Encourage your child to always play by the Laws of the Game
- Teach young children that honest endeavour is as important as winning, so that the result of each game is accepted without disappointment
- Help young people to work towards skill improvement and good sportsmanship
- Set a good example by applauding good play on both sides
- Never ridicule, humiliate, or shout at young players for making a mistake or losing a match
- Do not place emphasis on winning at all costs
- Do not force an unwilling child to participate in the playing of rugby. If the child is to play, he/she will do so in good time through your encouragement
- Support all efforts to remove ALL verbal & physical abuse from rugby
- As a spectator, do not use profane language or harass referees, coaches or players
- Do not publicly question the referee's judgment and never their honesty
- Always let your coach know if your child has an injury - there is no youth sport or match, worth a lifetime of impairment
- Recognize the value and importance of volunteer administrators, referees and coaches
- Take the time to learn about rugby, qualities of the Game of Rugby and uphold these values
- Understand the value of team sport and its importance

FOR SPECTATORS

- Remember that although young people play organised rugby, they are not 'miniature professional players'
- Be on your best behaviour and lead by example. Do not use profane language or harass referees, players, or coaches
- Applaud good play by the visiting team as well as your own
- Show respect for your team's opponents, without them there would not be a match
- Stay in appropriate spectator zones and never stray into the technical zones or onto the pitch
- Condemn the use of violence in all forms at every opportunity
- Verbal abuse of players or referees cannot be accepted in any shape or form
- Players or referees are not fair targets for ignorant behaviour
- Encourage young players to play by the Laws of the Game
- Spectators can contribute to the enjoyment of the event, and all involved
- Be proud of your team and the Game of Rugby
